Global Scenario

- ➤ The world's military expenditure totalled USD 2.1 trillion in 2021, marking the 7th year in a row of increased global military spending
- ➤ The five largest spenders in 2021 were United States, China, India, United Kingdom and Russia, together accounting for 62% of expenditure
- US and China alone accounted for 52% of the expenditure in the world's total military spending

- The United States, spent USD 801 billion to make up almost 38% of global military spending in 2021
- India is positioned as the 3rd largest military spender in the world, with its defence budget accounting for 2.15% of the country's total GDP
- Russia Ukraine war crises has resulted in defence industries looking for relocation, with India as an attractive destination

- ▶ India's current defence budget for 2022-23 stands at USD 70.6 Bn
- India targeting Indigenous Defence Production of USD 25 Bn by 2025
- ► Fleet modernization of USD 130 Bn planned across all armed services

- ▶ 68% of capital procurement budget in FY 2022-23 earmarked for domestic industry
- Major drive from the Indian Government to have indigenous Strategic Raw Material Production
- Defence industry base of over 8,000 MSMEs strengthens defence supply chain providing opportunities for JVs


Indian Scenario

Export -

- ▶ India recorded highest ever defence exports in the year 2021-22
- ▶ India accounts for 0.17% of global arms exports
- Over 30 Indian defence companies have exported arms and equipment to countries like Italy, Maldives, Sri Lanka, Russia, France
- ➤ The exports include personal protective items, defence electronics systems, mechanical equipment, offshore patrol vessels, advanced light helicopters, avionics suits, radio and radar systems

Import

- ▶ India was the largest importer of weapons in the year 2021-22
- Compared to 2012-16, the 2017-21 period saw imports falling by 21%


- > Strategically located away from international borders critical for defence equipment manufacturing


